Making transitions is never an easy thing. I remember particularly the time in my life when I went in to the Army. Basic Training was a very different life than I was used to as a 19 year old. Getting up at 5 a.m., eating breakfast, being told what to do all of the time (my mother only did that for part of the day), and learning to live as a soldier instead of a civilian. I made it through and look back at that time as very significant in my maturing as a young man.

First Baptist is moving through a time of transition too. Not that there are radical changes being considered for our church, but changes none-the-less. In essence this is a time of remembering what has been and is important to us as God's people here in our church. ## Great Things To Come to Belize

Summer is just around the corner, and First Baptist Church has plenty of things to be excited about in the upcoming months. One great thing FBC is doing is sending a team of 28 on a mission trip to Belize this July.

The team will spend the majority of their time in the village of Cristo Rey, which is located a few miles East of the Guatemala boarder. This large team plans to tackle four projects in Belize. They will hold a Vacation Bible School for the children that will include songs, skits, crafts, and a lot of Bible teaching.

Dr. James Hunter and Dr. Tim Burgiss will lead a dental ministry. They will take care of only some of the dental problems experienced by the people of Belize. Other members of the Belize team will act as dental assistants during these procedures. The team finds out next week just how much medicine and supplies will be donated from numerous non-profit organizations for the dental ministry in Belize.

The Belize Team will also reach out to the teenagers of Cristo Rey by taking advantage of fact that the FIFA world cup is this summer. The world cup is a soccer tournament with teams from all around the world. Since soccer is the Belize national sport, the team from FBC will host a mini world cup to encourage teens to come to church. While the teens are at the church they will learn different skills such as sowing, wood working, and general repairs. What is happening in the background of all this? The Lord's Prayer; all week the teens will be learning the words and meaning of the Lord's Prayer.

And as always the team will be involved in construction on the local church and surrounding homes of Cristo Rey. Please be in prayer for every one that is part of this team. They will be doing great things in Belize!
