Thank You that no matter how turbulent the storms of life become, You speak PEACE to the problem, providing rest for Your children. Thank You for the greatest of all relationships—the JOY of knowing You, laughing, crying, dancing with You, sharing life with You—incompletely now at best, but perfectly when we see You face to face. Last and most, thank You for loving us so much that You died for us; so much that You promised never to leave us or forsake us. We are totally secure in Your LOVE!
