Vision is key to any church's success. Proverbs 29:18 says, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." Vision is insight from God that gives us direction and draws us forward. Relationships, programming and management are all important aspects of a healthy congregation, but vision is paramount.

What could stand against.

The first vision for First Baptist Church of Statesville was seen in 1875. Fifteen individuals gathered at the court house to organize a Baptist witness in Statesville. Leading people to Christ and helping them to grow in their faith compelled this group. In fact, two people were baptized on that very first Sunday. Shortly thereafter, the congregation organized and started a comprehensive Sunday School.

Over the years First Baptist Church has renewed this vision as we have grown both in numbers and ministries. In fact, we solidified this vision when we chose our mission statement – "To know and to love Jesus Christ and to make him known." In the 1980s our church took a big step toward our vision when we funded and built the Family Life Center.

The original dream for the Family Life Center was to be an outreach tool to draw people together, so they might come closer to Christ and one another. Recreation and fellowship were the tools to be used, but the purpose was always to reach people. For many years this concept worked. Over the last decade, however, our facility has not always fulfilled its original purpose.

There are many reasons for this, such as: fewer young families in the area and congregation, hectic family schedules, fewer volunteers, inadequate staffing and more recreational opportunities from other groups. Focusing on the negative, however, will only serve to discourage us. I choose to focus on the potential that we have to re-vision what God is calling us to do with this wonderful bless-

Prayer Point E.M. Bounds on Faith in Prayer

"Prayer does not stand alone. It is not an isolated duty and independent principle. It lives in association with other Christian duties, is wedded to other principles, is a partner with other graces. But to faith, prayer is indissolubly joined. Faith gives it color and tone, shapes its character, and secures its results.

Our Lord puts trust as the very foundation of praying. The background of prayer is trust. The whole issuance of Christ's ministry and work was dependent on implicit trust in His Father.

When trust is perfect and without doubt, prayer is simply the outstretched hand, ready to receive.

Trust receives what prayer acquires.

Faith is nurtured and made powerful by prayer."

E. M. Bounds, one of the foremost expositors of Prayer, was born in Missouri in 1835. He died in 1913 having published only two books: "Preacher and Prayer" and "The Resurrection". After his death two friends assumed the task of publishing nine more books written by him.

Saturday, July 15 & Sunday, July 16

Our Miami Mission Team departed for Miami this Saturday, July 15. The team arrived safely in Miami Sunday around noon. That afternoon they had an orientation with Touching Miami With Love (TML), the organization our team will work with for the week. During the orientation, they learned the history of TML and the ministers. The team also took a tour of the facility.

During the training, the TML staff talked about cultural differences and urban poverty. TML encouraged the team, along with our church family, to research the phrase "the school to prison pipeline".

After orientation, most of group had a Cuban dinner in Little Havana, while the "Moms" bought groceries for bag lunches for the week.

Monday, July 17

Monday was our first day with the kids. It was awesome to see their excitement as they came in the door. It felt a lot like the first day of VBS. You plan and prepare. The day arrives and is more chaotic then you would like, but it is a great day.

We started the day with a devotion time. We sang songs, told a Bible story, and played a quick game. We also led crafts. The kids made lanterns out of clear Chinese take-out boxes tying in with TML's theme of "living in the light as God is in the light".

We also led an enrichment time that focuses on learning about different countries. South Africa is the first country we learned about. We made "crunches" - delicious cookie bars. We also tried rooibos tea. We learned a few words in Zulu and colored the flag for South Africa.

Our day ended with a time of worship with the children - a big highlight of the day. These kids get so excited about singing songs to Jesus!

We are excited for our second day with the kids. Time is moving so fast!

Tuesday, July 18 & Wednesday, July 19

Tuesday was a much smoother day! The kids enjoyed our devotion time about Gideon and, they are really catching on to the songs and movements we are doing this week. For visual arts we made picture frames, and in Enrichment we learned about Kazakhstan.

Our team enjoyed our evening by celebrating Taco Tuesday at Coyo Taco, and a walk through the Winwood Walls Graffiti Art District.

Wednesday was a long and busy day. Our team arrived at TML at 8:30 a.m. and did not leave until 7:45 p.m. We had a good day. Our teens have been doing a great job helping lead devotions and enrichment. It was awesome to see some of our team share their personal experiences in Belize.

The kids were beyond excited about Wednesday evening's cookout and their field trip on Thursday. The community cookout was a success. We were able to serve many families that partner with TML.

Today we go with the kids to Ninja Lounge, an indoor trampoline park. We are excited to hang out with them in a different environment.
