

It Was For This He Had Come

On March 5, 1994, Deputy Sheriff Lloyd Prescott was teaching a class for police officers in the Salt Lake City Library. As he stepped into the hallway he noticed a gunman herding 18 hostages into the next room. Quickly, the deputy (dressed in street clothes) joined the group and became the nineteenth hostage. When the gunman announced the order in which the hostages would be executed, Prescott identified himself as a cop. In the scuffle that followed, Prescott, in self-defense fatally shot the armed man. The hostages were released unharmed.

God dressed Himself in street clothes and entered our world, joining us who are held hostage to sin. On the cross, Jesus identified Himself and set free from the penalty and power of sin all who would believe in Him. It was not simply a matter of dying any death, or of a quick death. What He endured helps us to understand the ugliness of our failings and rebellion against God. It is no small thing to be separated from our Creator. It took a powerful work to alter the effects of sin.

In John 19:1-3 we read, "Then Pilate took Jesus and had Him flogged. The soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on His head. They clothed Him in a purple robe and went up to Him again and again, saying, 'Hail, king of the Jews!' And they struck Him in the face."

No simple matter, being turned over to hardened and cruel men and to go through this when you are innocent!

Paul, the Apostle writes, "He humbled Himself and became obedient, obedient even to death on a cross!"

There is a terrible twist of irony in how we find God on trial before the Jewish leaders and Roman governor. This absurdity and rejection found itself in Jesus continuing to fulfill His mission: no matter how difficult, no matter how horrible, no matter how unjust! Jesus Christ, beaten to the point of death, taunted and mocked, spat upon, identified as a criminal, was tried before human beings, and "sentenced to die!"

It was for this He had come!!!

John continues in John 19:6, "As soon as the chief priests and their officials saw Him, they shouted, "Crucify! Crucify!" The indignity continued with Pilate, afraid and trying to get out of a difficult spot, gave in to Christ's accusers. John 19:15,16, 'The crowd shouted, "Take Him away! Take Him away! Crucify Him!'...Finally Pilate handed Him over to them to be crucified." John 19:16-18, "So the soldiers took charge of Jesus. They made Christ carry His own cross. He went out to the place of the Skull (which is Aramaic is called Golgotha). Here they crucified Him, and with Him two others - one on each side and Jesus in the middle."

In this place, called the place of the skull, was where the bodies of rapists, extortionists, and murderers breathed their last breath. There God made flesh allowed Himself to be nailed to a cross.

God manifested in the extreme.

What can we say to this as we meditate during this special season? Also, nothing but, "Hallelujah!"

The National Day is Prayer is scheduled for Thursday, May 1, 2014. This will be the beginning of a six-month effort to mobilize our nation to prayer. Second Chronicles 7:14 makes it clear that God cares about and responds to the attitudes and actions of His people.

The theme for the 2014 National Day of Prayer observance is "One Voice, United in Prayer," based on Romans 15:6. The virtue that once defined our country is deteriorating rapidly and is being invaded by evils. We must humble ourselves before Almighty God and seek His forgiveness and restoration.

Thankfully we serve a God who stands ready to work in ways that exceed all of our expectations. His Word offers his heartening

reminder: "Surely the arm of the Lord is not too short to save, nor His ear too dull to hear" (Isaiah 59:1).
