I would like to highlight three significant opportunities. You can find more details within this newsletter, but I wanted to make sure you saw each of these on the front page.

Hurricane Helene Relief

Our hearts go out to all who have been affected by the devastation of Hurricane Helene. We are particularly aware of our neighbors in surrounding counties. Our church is taking a three-pronged approach to helping.

First, we have immediately sent \$1,500 from our disaster relief funds to Samaritan's Purse. We chose this partner because they are closest to the areas of need and are already primed to go. Second, we are encouraging you to take relief supplies to the



Statesville Airport to be flown into areas that are inaccessible by road. Third, we will be organizing mission trips to follow up once rescue workers say it is clear for others to join relief efforts.

World Communion Sunday

This Sunday, October 6, 2024, is World Communion Sunday. We will join Christians around the globe in a mass celebration of the Lord's Supper. Jesus gave this meal as a reminder of his sacrifice and call for us to be one body. It is a very moving day, and I urge you to be present.



The following items are being collected at Statesville Airport to be flown into areas of need within our state. As roads open, they will also be taken in by truck.

sports drink (powders packets), hydration packs, baby wipes, diapers (children & adults), baby formula, bug spray, sunscreen, plastic utensils, manual can openers, trash bags (13 gallon or contractor bags), non-perishable food, cleaning supplies, plastic tarps, toothbrushes, toothpaste, toiletries, pet food, sanitizer wipes, feminine hygiene products, heavy duty work gloves, socks (all sizes), and water

Items NOT accepted: used clothing, Hazmat, most chemicals (including bleach), fuel, flammable items

If you have items to donate, please take them to the airport. We are also accepting monetary donations at the church, which will be forwarded to relief agencies.

If you are interested in participating in direct relief efforts at a later date, please contact our Minister of Missions, Elizabeth Kilby at the church.
